Introduction

We want to see children grow up to have a lasting faith, but churches only have one or two hours a week to input into their lives.

Parents are the biggest influence on their children growing in faith, so we need to work together to see the next generation develop a personal, living faith of their own.

Deuteronomy 6:6-7 says:

'These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.'

Faith is built in the everyday. So how can we help parents identify those everyday opportunities to inspire faith?

We want to help you equip parents to invest in their children's spirituality at home, with the support of the church gathering round them.



What builds faith?

Research suggests there are key elements which can help to inspire children's faith. Our resources have been created to help churches and parents to invest in these different elements.

Equip **parents**

Peer support is really beneficial for parents. Get parents and carers together to spark friendships and talk through challenges, opportunities, and why it's important to share faith at home.

Top tips

Get parents together

Once a month, once a term – whatever timing works, but get them talking about how to help their children grow in faith.

- **Give reminders to parents** Everyday ideas or resources to prompt them to keep making the most of the everyday opportunities.
- **Pray for parents in your main church services regularly** Reassure them you're supporting them and cheering them on.

Connect the **church**


The church plays a vital role in supporting parents and children. When children feel they belong in God's wider family it can really encourage their faith.

Top tips

- Encourage intergenerational relationships
 Whether it's a church picnic, a mentor scheme, all-age services

 intergenerational interaction helps children see God at work
 in every stage of life.
- Offer opportunities for children and families to serve in church Giving children a role helps them feel valued and increases their sense of belonging to the church family.
- Ask people to pray for specific families or children Encourage the whole church to support the families in your church.
